- We probably wouldn't have guessed that one effect of holding Virtual Harmony University would be to expand the diversity of faculty - something we had already moved toward, but were able to amplify to great success.

Even while buffeted by challenges brought by the pandemic, we've continued to advance our strategic plan, through inclusion webinars that help BHS welcome more singers, broader engagement with BHS singing communities and districts, and innovative programming for youth. We've managed through this despite budget challenges, legal issues, and staff reductions — because our staff and Board leadership have stayed true to our overall vision of more people singing more barbershop in more ways.

Again and again, throughout this Impact Report, you'll see the resilience that sustained us —and that will bring us to a new world in the years to come.

Headquartered in Nashville, Tennessee since 2007, our nonprofit organization provides active programs and resources in music education, publishing, performance, and community outreach.


A truly American artform, barbershop harmony is music for all people












CULTURE OF DEEP FRIENDSHIP AND MUSIC

NURTURING FUTURE SINGERS

Virtual Junior Quartet Contest



In October 2020, the Barbershop Harmony Society introduced a brand new event in the a cappella world: the Virtual Junior Quartet Challenge! With the reimagining of the Midwinter Convention,

the Barbershop Harmony Society offered an alternative singing opportunity for junior quartets (18 & under), while also providing music educators with the option to include this in their virtual classrooms.

We highly encouraged physically distant singing and creative fun. This FREE event was open to ALL quartets of any gender with members aged 18 and under.

With no way to know how many quartets would participate, we were delighted to welcome 17 quartets - many of whom had never before participated in any Barbershop Harmony Society event!

Category 4 Barbershop, hailing from Liberty High School in Bethlehem, PA, emerged at the top, with favorites selected by more than 8,600 fans!

Songwriter Collaboration



Back in December of 2020 we launched our "Songwriter Collaboration" pilot program with the

Nashville Songwriters Association International (NSAI). We invited Junior Choruses who were planning on participating in our Junior Chorus Invitational at our 2021 Midwinter convention in New York to participate in this pilot by working with an NSAI songwriter, a barbershop arranger, and have learning tracks created for their chorus to premiere these original songs at our Midwinter convention in Pasadena.

Three groups agreed to compete: Anna Coyotes (Anna, TX), Here Comes Treble (Burlington, WI), and Columbus High School (Columbus, NE).

The Songwriter Collaboration pilot was not only an opportunity to continue our connection with Junior choruses, but it was also needed, maybe even more so, to pass the preservation of Barbershop harmony into the hands of these young singers. It's through these unique Next Generation Barbershop opportunities that we can educate and inspire our future barbershoppers.

PRESERVATION IMPACTS MULTIPLE GENERATIONS OF SINGERS

Though events in 2021 were cancelled across all our singing communities' calendars, the work continued to help breathe life into much of our content, both old and new.

In 2021, we:

Cataloged CDs from the late BHS historian **Grady Kerr Collection** and other sources.

Digitized **tens of thousands** of photographs from multiple sources, including curated binders of already-developed photos, collections of film negatives from past major conventions dating back to the 1950s, and quartet and chorus portraits from convention scrapbooks.

Digitized **several hundred** Quartet and Chorus 78 and 33-1/3 phonorecords.

Established files for printed material and ephemera from International Conventions 1995 to the present.

Assimilated Grady Kerr's historical files into BHS files.

Sent the Society's Victrola and Edison **Cylinder Phonographs** out to *Music City Clocks* to be serviced and restored to top-level playing condition.

Released 49 videos in our Wayback Wednesdays series of restored legendary barbershop performances from our archives, including from our reel-to-reel collection.







INSPIRING DIVERSE SINGING COMMUNITIES

Dollars Driving Local Impact

The Barbershop Harmony Society received over \$321,000 towards philanthropic programs in 2021 from generous BHS donors. This total was an 80%



increase over 2020 giving amounts. 85% of a donor's gift can be designated to its District or Chapter. In 2021, 128 singing

communities received donations totaling \$70,608.

The BHS Development team worked in 2021 to increase fundraising support to more singing communities by specifically working with over a dozen chapter direct fundraising pilots (to be fully launched in 2022). Working with chapter leadership, we will:

- Assess the chapter's fundraising activities
- Assist in setting a goal and develop a fundraising plan
- Build a fundraising web page for donation, &
- Provide tools for maximum success

Reach continues to expand


